WORKSHOPS

27th March- Analysis of finger print & handwriting.

The law institute organized a workshop on “Analysis of fingerprint and handwriting in forensic science”. The

GUEST LECTURES

12th February -Jurisprudential interpretation

6th January -Guru Gobind Singh
