

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### GUEST LECTURES/WORKSHOPS/SEMINARS

#### 29<sup>th</sup> July- Sangoshti on Human Re- engineering

The Institute in association with the Institution of Engineers, Ghaziabad, organized an insightful sangoshti on the topic “Human Re-engineering”. The event witnessed the presence of distinguished speakers and guests from diverse professional and academic backgrounds.

The speakers shared insights on health, cultural values, skill development, ethics and adaptability for personal and professional growth. The interactive session inspired students to enhance their potential and apply these learnings in real-life scenarios.

#### 13<sup>th</sup> August-Art and Craft workshop

Professor of Law, University of Delhi. The lecture was focused on the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita and its provisions for criminal defence and protection of rights of innocent persons. The students gained insights into new criminal laws framework and its practical applications.

#### 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> September-Seminar on Indian Knowledge System (IKS)

The department of Teacher Education organized a two-day national seminar on "Indian Knowledge System and Contemporary Education". The seminar focused on how AI learns to generate various

### 26<sup>th</sup> September - Guest lecture on Sociological School of Jurisprudence.

## MOCK TRIAL


